

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

Jacqui Cooper 5-time Olympian & 5-time World Champion

Championing Your Attitude: This is what is needed to get to the top and stay at the top; it's a mindset, an outlook, and an attitude we can all have. Jacqui finished her career competing at her 5th Winter Olympics in Vancouver, Canada. She attributes her success over 20 years to passion, self-belief and commitment, but above all, it was her "champion attitude" that gave her longevity and success in her sport. It was an attitude more than just winning and losing; it was an attitude to working in a team, an attitude to her competitors, and attitude to adversity, an attitude to change, and an attitude to a setback; it was an attitude to everything. Jacqui created a positive internal

dialogue and a healthy ability to stay positive when everyone and everything

Through honest, authentic and energic storytelling, Jacqui's session will be compelling, believable and relatable. Jacqui's presentation will inspire change; to rise to a higher place of commitment, self-belief, and passion with a drive to do and want more both personally and professionally. In her long and decorated career, Jacqui competed in 139 World Cup Events, 9 World Championships and 5 Winter Olympic teams. She is the first Australian woman in history (Summer or Winter Games) to have enjoyed this honour. With a record 5 world titles, 39 World Cup medals, 25 World Cup wins and 3 major World Championship medals, Jacqui Cooper is indisputably the greatest aerial skier of all time. Her resilient and entrepreneurial spirit in sport is still the foundation for her success beyond the ski suit.

Good People in a Complex System: Professor Susan James Relly is the Head of the School of Education; Faculty of Arts, Business, Law, and Economics, at the University of Adelaide. Susan completed a Bachelor of Education at Queensland University of Technology (QUT) and read for a MSc in Comparative and International Education and a DPhil in Education at the University of Oxford. Susan's entire career has been in education in various forms: she taught in secondary schools in Australia and England before starting her academic career. She is an Honorary Research Fellow and former Deputy Dean of the Department of Education and Associate Head (Education) of the Social Sciences Division at the University of Oxford. Her research interests are in the areas of technical and vocational education and training policy, vocational excellence, apprenticeship, the tertiary landscape and skills economy.



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



Kira and the team are leading SPARC's skills and training policy and research program of work, which includes streams of work on employment based training, employability, place-based innovation partnerships with industry for co-designing new pathways to entry level work, and skills for enabling the green transition. Prior to joining BSL in early 2020, Kira spent more 15 years at the University of Melbourne, where she completed more than 35 grant funded and commissioned research projects, with a focus on youth transitions and vocational education. 



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

Troy has been awarded the Elizabeth Anne Bailey Memorial Award for research he did into the literacy levels in the construction industry.

He was also a recipient of the NSW Premier's Teaching scholarship in 2018 which took him to numerous colleges across the UK and Ireland to research good practice in supporting literacy and numeracy challenged students within a competency-based training system.

take on a hands-on trade that let him spend time outside. Living just 20km (on the Victorian side) from the Victoria-New South Wales border, Jayden decided to undertake a Certificate III in Bricklaying and Blocklaying at TAFE NSW Albury, where he found his calling.

Under the tutelage of his TAFE teacher Glenn Kilpatrick, Jayden decided to enter a WorldSkills regional competition in 2019 to showcase his skills in front of other people. There, his impressive performance earned him an invite to compete at the 2021 WorldSkills Australia National Championships, where he was awarded a gold medal.

Jayden lends credit for his success so far to his teacher Glenn, who put a considerable amount of effort and time into his training. Says Jayden, "I wouldn't be the bricklayer I am today without him."

As a self-confessed bricklaying obsessive (says Jayden, "I live and breath bricklaying. If I'm not laying bricks I'm at home watching people lay bricks on the internet. It's so addictive.") Jayden knows that there's plenty of talent in his industry, but believe his skill is up there with the best. He also understands that dedication to skills excellence is crucial for staying on top his bricklaying game.

"Pride in what you do as a profession is very important," says Jayden. "At the end of the day, you work so hard – why not go home knowing that the hard work you put in is for top quality craftsmanship rather than mediocre?"

Jayden competed at the 46th WorldSkills Competition 2022, Special Edition in Salzburg, Austria, in Bricklaying against 18 countries. Jayden placed 11th. Since competing, Jayden is passionate about passing his knowledge and tips and tricks he learnt along to the way to other looking to follow his example and represent Australia in Bricklaying. Anne Russell 2022 Skillaroo (Hairdressing)

Anne Russell has wanted to be a hairdresser for as long as she can remember.

Inspired by her uncle Scott Sloan – an award-winning Sydney hairstylist – Anne successfully completed a Certificate III in Hairdressing at TAFE NSW Riverina – Wagga in her quest to carve out her own career in the industry.

Participating in hair competitions has long been one of Anne's goals, which led her to enter a WorldSkills regional competition. There, her performance was earned her an invite to compete at the 2021 WorldSkills Australia National Championships, where she thrived in the competition environment and took walked away with some new skills, greater confidence and a silver medal.

Anne competed at the 46th WorldSkills Competition 2022, Special Edition in Helsinki, Finland in Hairdressing against 19 countries. Anne placed 6th and achieved a Medallion for Excellence.

After the International Competition, she wants to continue competing in hairdressing competitions and build a name for herself. She also wants to take her newly-acquired knowledge back to her home town of Junee in the Riverina, and work with the TAFE in helping smaller communities gain access to education that can only normally be found in the cities.

When asked what she's learned so far, Anne says, "I have learnt so much so far on this journey.

One if my biggest takeaways from this experience is that if you believe in yourself and put in the hard work, your skills will get better. The more you train and put in the hard yards, you will see progress."
